ABOUT MAP EDUCATION

MAP Education offers students aged 11-16, who are having difficulty accessing mainstream education, the opportunity to study Art and Design and Music and Creative Media, alongside Maths and English.





MEETING NEEDS

At MAP we work closely with schools, homes and a range of supporting agencies to provide placements that meet a range of needs:

- Supporting students who are being assessed for EHCP and specialist placements.
- Short term KS3 placements with a focus on returning to mainstream education.
- Longer term placements studying BTEC qualifications and functional skills.
- Providing places for students who are between long term placements, changing schools or moving between providers.
- Supporting students who are attending education after a long period of disengagement.

FUNCTIONAL SKILLS

Within all of these subjects there are many examples of Maths and English and we provide one to one support from an assessor to help students build upon these examples and study for stand alone functional skills qualifications.

Students have opportunities to experiment with graphics and illustration, digital photography and film, digital media, screen printing, DJing, painting, drawing and music production.

This education programme was set up in 2008 by the charity MAP as an approved off site provider and offers Edexcel BTEC qualifications as well as Edexcel functional skills certificates


PROGRESSION OPPORTUNITIES



The functional skills course builds upon examples that are already found within the creative activities undertaken at MAP, providing a practical way for students to relate to the maths and English activities that they sometimes struggle with. Building on these examples, we give students one to one support in working through stand alone functional skills exercises with a range of computer based, paper based, and practical activities.

OUTCOMES

Below are some examples of the skills and awarenesses learners will develop through their engagement with the Maths and English qualifications, all of which can then be reapplied to the undertaking of a practical, creative project, such as working out the costs of printing your own t-shirt designs, or a project involving the release of music online:

Presenting information, points of view, and ideas clearly and logically. Utilising information contained in texts from different sources.

Responding appropriately to comments and requests.

Recognising when a situation has aspects that can be demonstrated with maths.

Deciding on the appropriate methods and tools, including ICT, to use in a situation.


